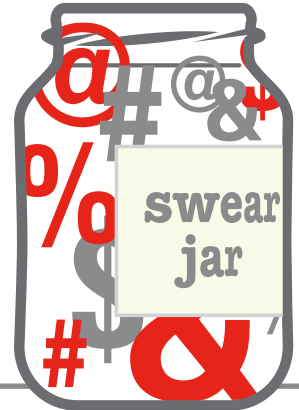
Alberta

Hopefully the bar owner has a bar of soap: it's illegal to use vulgar or profane language in a licensed establishment.



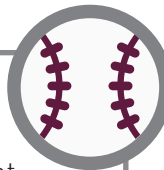
Québec

Nova Scotia

Sorry, you can't pick up a draught while you draft your hockey pool. No owners or patrons can run a sports pool in a bar.
