

CANADA SUMMER JOBS GRANT (CSJ)

The **CSJ provides wage subsidies** to support employers with **50 or fewer full-time employees** to create summer work experiences for **youth aged 15 to 30 years**.

Applications are open for a month-long period from **November-December**.

TIP: Monitor the CSJ [website](#) beginning in Sept for announcements and opening of application period.

OBJECTIVES

The CSJ is intended to provide quality work experiences for youth to develop and improve skills, as well as access to the labour market for youth with barriers to employment.

ELIGIBILITY

Employers with 50 or fewer full-time employees across Canada at the time of application are eligible for the CSJ (30 hours or more per week is considered full-time).

Independent owners of franchises are eligible if there are 50 or fewer full-time employees working full-time in the franchise owner's operations across Canada, regardless of the number of business numbers involved

REIMBURSEMENTS

Employers are eligible to receive funding for up to 50% of the provincial or territorial minimum hourly wage

Overhead costs for youth with disabilities (i.e., accommodations)

Advances of up to 75% for projects \$100,000 and under, 50% for projects \$100,001 and over.

QUALIFYING JOBS & JOB SEEKERS

Full-time work (min. 30, max. 40 hours/week) between Apr start date and Aug end date (specific dates vary year-to-year) for a minimum of 6 weeks to a maximum of 16 weeks

Youth must be between 15 - 30 years of age at the beginning of the employment period

Must be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person to whom refugee protection has been conferred for the duration of the employment

International students are not eligible participants

Must have a valid Social Insurance Number at the start of employment and be legally entitled to work in Canada
